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*Directions for Scavenger Hunt of Church Hill:*

**1. Tour of St. John's Church**

*\*Exit St. John's from the Broad Street entrance and take a right on 25<sup>th</sup> St.*

**2. St. Patrick's Cathedral (east side of 25<sup>th</sup> Street)**

*\*Continue down 25<sup>th</sup> Street. and take a left on E. Grace St.*

**3. Adams Double House, 2501-03 E. Grace Street**

**4. Morris Cottage, 2500 E. Grace Street**

*\*Continue east on East Grace Street.*

**5. 2715 & 2717 E. Grace Street – Note cast iron porches**

*\*Take a right on 28<sup>th</sup> Street. and continue south to Libby Park and Confederate Monument; go left on E. Franklin and right on 29<sup>th</sup> Street to reach the Confederate monument*

**6. Luther Libby House, 1 N. 29<sup>th</sup> Street**

*\*Continue to Church Hill overlook on south side of Confederate Monument*

**7. Libby Park Overlook, Richmond's namesake**

*\*Go north on 29<sup>th</sup> Street and take a left on E. Franklin; continue down for a few blocks*

**8. 2617 E. Franklin Street**

**9. Turner-Reed House, corner of 26<sup>th</sup> and E. Franklin**

*\*Take a right on 26th Street. and then a left on E. Grace St.*

**10. 2306 E. Grace Street**

*\*Continue west on E. Grace Street*

**11. Monte Maria Convent, 2200 block of E. Grace Street**

**12. View of the City of Richmond**

*\*Double back and head east on E. Grace Street*

**13. 2200 E. Grace Street**

*\*Take a left on 23<sup>rd</sup> Street; take a right into the "alley"*

**14. Mews-entire alleyway**

By the end of this tour you will have identified 10 different styles of architecture as well as important lessons in early Richmond history. **Street parking is available around St. John's Church.**
