



First Precinct - Sector 111 Community Report

During the month of November, the Sector experienced a 30% decrease in Major Crime; a 38% increase in violent crime (8 incidents reported in 2008 compared to 11 in 2009) and a 39% decrease in property crime (59 incidents reported in 2008 compared to 36 in 2009). The 11 violent crimes reported included: 1 Aggravated Assault (Domestic related), 3 Aggravated Assaults and 7 robberies. Of the 11 violent incidents reported 7 of them have been cleared and the remaining 4 are still being investigated by detectives. The current trend in Property Crime is thefts related to motor vehicles.

During the next month our focus is going to be on robberies in the Fulton and Church Hill North neighborhoods, officers will be walking and on directed patrol assignments in those areas. We will also continue to watch for trends in burglaries and thefts related to motor vehicles in other neighborhoods.

With the Holiday Season here and the time change it is important that you remain alert and aware of our surroundings. You should always park in well lighted areas and notify us if there is any street lights out. You should avoid carrying large sums of money and using ATM's at night. Also place packages in the trunk of your vehicle where they can't be seen.

Crime Trends for September:

- Church Hill - no current trend.
- Chimborazo - no current trend.
- Church Hill North - residential burglaries.
- Fulton - violent crime - robbery.
- Oakwood - no current trend.
- Union Hill - no current trend.
