***Crime Prevention Tips***

- 1. Auto Thefts- Don't leave vehicles running unattended.***
- 2. Burglaries- When possible, vary the times when leaving and returning home, timers on lights are good deterrents. Ensure door and window locks work. Let police know when you will be away for an extended period of time. Notify police of strangers lurking in your neighborhood or any suspicious persons, vehicles or activity.***
- 3. Robberies- Walk in well lighted areas. Be aware of your surroundings. Don't carry large amounts of money on your person. Report suspicious persons in your neighborhoods. When walking during late hours, try not to do so alone.***
