## First Precinct - Sector 111

Greetings,

Sector 111 for the month of October showed a 30% reduction in Violent Crime compared to the same reporting period last year. Property Crime was reduced by 29% for this reporting period as well. Some of the neighborhood highlights for the month of October are Church Hill and Union Hill. Church Hill experienced a welcome 60% reduction in overall crime while Union Hill was treated to a 50% reduction in overall crime. Some of this can be attributed to arresting Barry Coles (mug shot included) for a larceny in the restored area. He is well known to the Richmond Police Department and has 18 years of comeback time over his head from previous crimes he has committed in the area. We were also able to arrest a couple juveniles in these areas that are suspected to be involved in larcenies. Another notable arrest was in the 700 blk of N. 27th Street, Isaac Wright (mug shot included) was arrested for Grand Larceny of construction items from a house that was being renovated.

Taking a look at property crime for the month of October, we had a number of GPS devices stolen from vehicles in Sector 111. I know that it is an inconvenience to take it out of a vehicle when not in use, but it is less an inconvenience than having a window broken out of your vehicle and the device stolen. We had one package taken off a porch and are looking to get ahead of this before it becomes an issue this holiday season. Please be mindful of this issue in the upcoming months. We only had one moped stolen in October. In the recent months this number had been a lot higher. Please continue to be vigilant in securing mopeds and bicycles inside when possible or out of sight from opportunistic criminals.

Community support continues to be the cornerstone of the reductions we have seen. An alert citizen helped us get another individual off the street this month that was wanted for a Burglary and Grand Larceny. This individual was also wanted in another jurisdiction for similar offenses. I have also included his mug shot. As always, lets keep up the good work together!

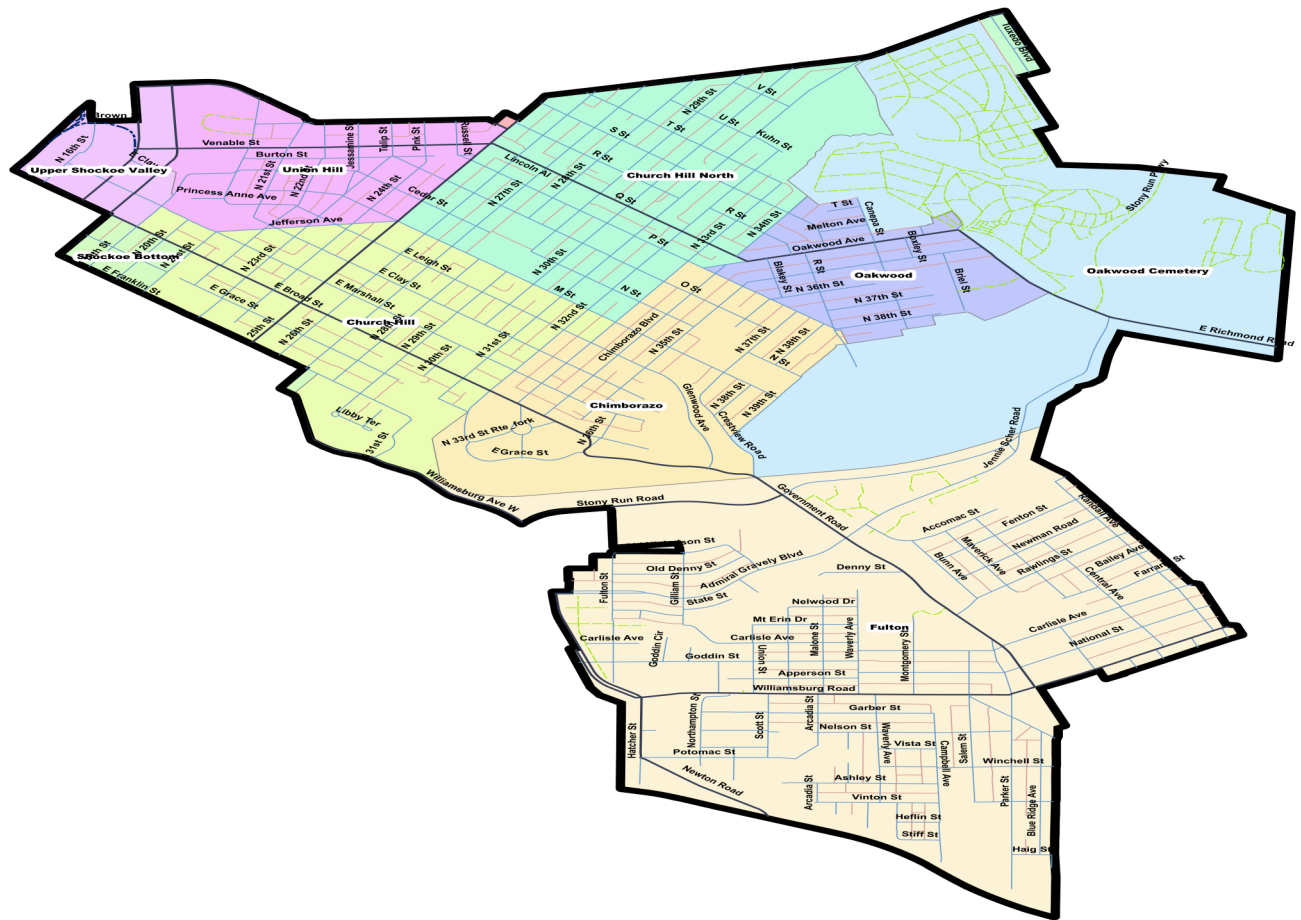
