## First Precinct - Sector 111

Greetings,

So far this year we have had 41 violent crimes compared to 34 last year. Violent crime in May was up from last year from 3 to 8 offenses. Last year we averaged 7.6 violent crimes to put that figure in perspective. We went from 0 to 4 in robberies. We are up 3 robberies this year compared to last year. These robberies occurred in Church Hill North, Union Hill, Fulton, and Church Hill. Aggravated Assaults went from 2 to 4. This is the violent crime category that we have seen the notable increase this year. We are at 19 compared to 13. A lot of these are attributed to people with poor interpersonal skills assaulting known parties. Three of the violent crimes have been solved this month and we have strong leads in 2 of the robberies.

Property crime for May was up by 1 from last year. Year to date property crime is down by -9%. Burglaries went from 7 to 8. Five of these were from sheds. Two were residential and one was commercial. Larcenies in general went from 24 to 26 in May. All other larcenies went from 5 to 10, these are typically crimes of opportunity where thieves are taking what is not secured and they can make a quick dollar. Bicycles, Lawn Equipment, and tools continue to be a hot item to steal whether they are in a backyard or a shed. Theft from Motor Vehicles have gone down from 9 to 5 but Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts have gone from 1 to 4. 3 of these were license plates. 3 of these occurred in Greater Fulton and the other in Union Hill. We did not have any Motor Vehicle Thefts or Moped Thefts. Overall crime for May was up by 16% compared to last year but if you compare it to the monthly overall crime average of 55 from last year then we were down by -22%. If you are totally confused then just remember this, total crime year to date in Sector 111 is down -5%.

If I have not put you to sleep with the numbers then let me tell you about some exciting things that have occurred recently in the sector. We recently executed a search warrant on Yonnie's Barbershop in Greater Fulton as a result of a drug investigation. This investigation was started from citizens complaints about drug dealing going on in and out of the barbershop. Two people were arrested the day of the search warrant and the investigation is still continuing. This investigation involved different units in the Richmond Police Department and couldn't have occurred without backing from the community. Another search warrant was executed in the 1400 block of National Street. This was regarding graffiti but led to a drug search warrant which led to the residents moving on from the neighborhood. As always thank you for the hard work you, the citizens, contribute to helping us make Sector 111 a safer place to live and work!

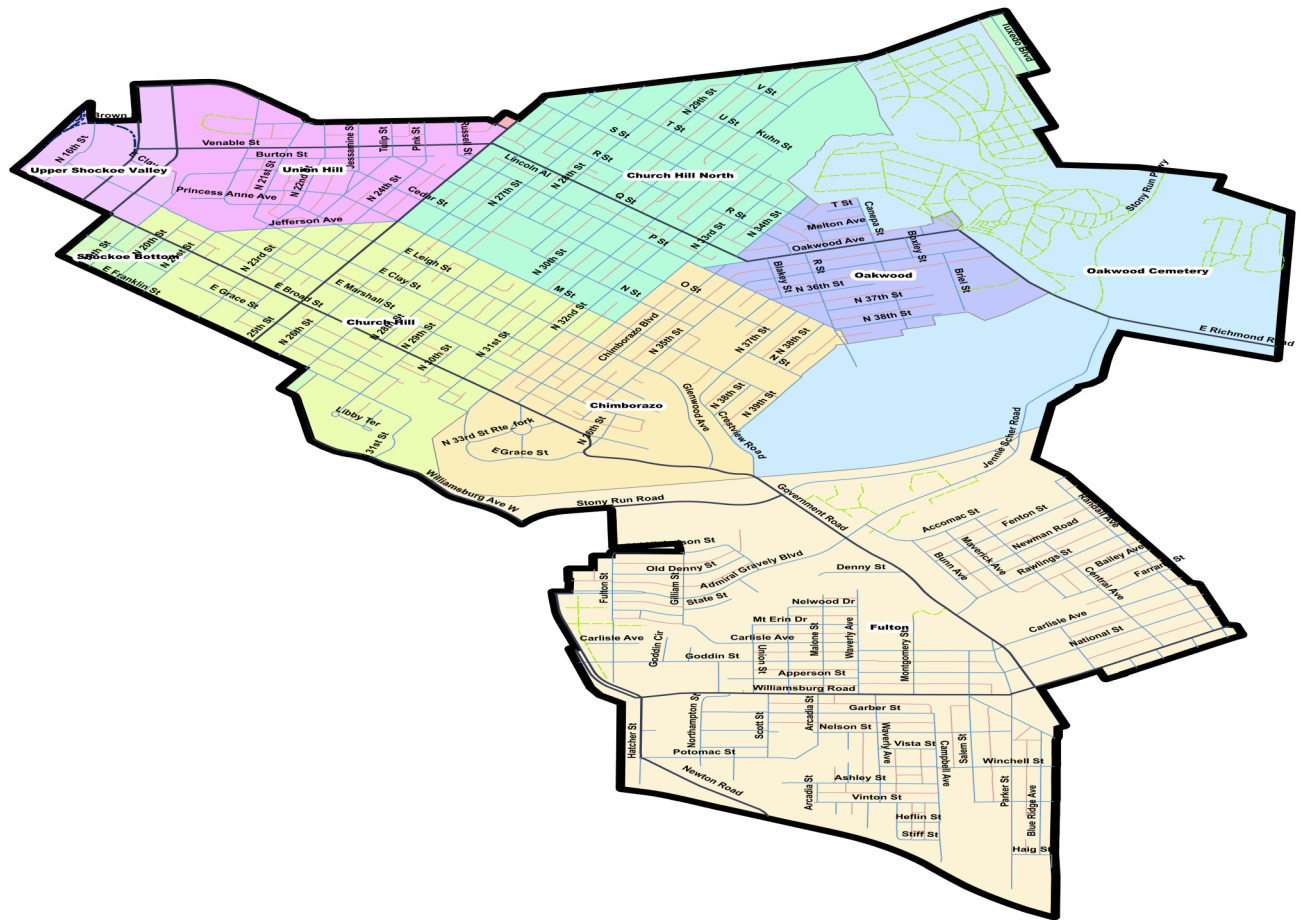
