Oh yeah; it was also about celebrating Jesus' birthday... but we talked about Jesus every Sunday in church all year long. Christmas was to me, as a child, about the joy of receiving toys, good stuff, good food, sweets and playing with friends.

In my neighborhood 'skates' were the 'number 1' gift you could get. If you got your brand new Union Hardware #5 skates for Christmas, that was it..., it was on all day long. By 8 o'clock every Christmas morning I did my usual ritual... unwrapped my brand new Union Hardware #5's... loaded my pockets with hard Christmas candy, an assortment of nuts, slice of fruitcake... my skate key (which I'd always lose before days end) and with unbridled enthusiasm and excitement joined the gathering throng of like-minded holiday celebrants... all whom were sporting their brand new Union Hardware #5 skates.

I remember one Christmas morning my younger sister unwrapped her skates before I did... to our surprise and to her dismay, they were not Union Hardware #5's. I had never seen skates like those before... they looked like knock offs of a knock off brand... they had what looked like red hub caps on the wheels... they were small and not sturdy. I remember thinking... there's no way she's going to be able to take Spread Eagle hill or skate the cement circle in the new Projects in those things... let alone trying to master the infamous St. James Street hill that every skater had to conquer before you were recognized in the neighborhood as a legit and bonafide skater. The infamous and scary St. James Street hill was, without a doubt, the portal one must travel through in order to receive your 'Rites of Passage' in the skate world. Well, as my sister stood there with those atrocities in her hands staring into an abyss of dismayed disbelief, despair and dissatisfaction; I looked at the wrapped gift with my name on it. With my heart beating like a bass drum... I slowly unwrapped my gift... to my surprise as my eyes quickly gazed upon the partially unwrapped set of skates... suddenly there was the insignia I was so desperately searching for... 'Union Hardware #5'... Thank You

Suddenly I could hear the sweet noise of skate wheels echoing from the vast avenues of pavement outside our living room window... I looked at my despondent spirited sister and said, 'You're going to have to take this up with Mama,.. I gotta go'. Oh how I loved Christmas time as a blessed child... taking always for granted that my brand new skates, new school clothes, turkey, ham, greens, sweet potatoes, mac & cheese, homemade potato salad, cakes, pies, Christmas candy, nuts, fruit and the beautiful smiling faces of family and friends would be with me in holiday celebration forever.

But it was several Christmas seasons later... I'll never forget that one time that there were no new skates... no new clothes... a scarcity of hard candy and nuts... no sentilating aromas of turkey or ham smells tantalizing and serenading my nostrils from the kitchen stove. I remember grabbing this huge apple from the kitchen table and walking through the neighborhood that Christmas morning... suddenly I was invisible... I saw many smiling faced skaters passing by but they had too much joy and fun in their eyes, that they couldn't see me... I visited some of my friends, they were busy unwrapping gifts and feasting to see that I was giftless and foodless.. so after a while I proceeded to eat my apple and invisibly walk back through my beloved neighborhood, home. That was a one-time Christmas holiday experience... I don't know what happened financially that year but it never happened again. But as I reflect back, I realize that that Christmas holiday experience of lack and disparity was the greatest Christmas gift I've ever received... for it was that Christmas of having to go without that gave me the greatest and deepest appreciation of being abundantly blessed than all of my previous Christmas' combined... I gained a small degree of profound wisdom that year. Years later I wrote this poem 'For the Child with Hunger Near' which was published on the front page of the Leaguer Magazine in December 1980... it was the forerunner for a 'Feed the Needy & Toy Drive campaign that holiday season.

Being invisible that one Christmas season has allowed me to recognize the daily invisibility of others... and to whenever possible, give as often as I can. 'For the Child with Hunger Near'

Christmas Eve sure is swell, Mistletoe, that turkey smell, To the child who's got it all On Christmas day gonna have a ball

Oh, but for the child with hunger near Christmas's just another day of the year He can't smile, but sheds a tear It's Christmas time and he's tryin to live

Christmas comes but once a year,
Every heart is poised to give
But for the child with hunger near
It's Christmas time and he's tryin to live

You and I, the lucky ones Christmas to us a lot of fun, See the toys for the boys and girls, Sing of joy throughout the world

Oh, but for the child who's never seen
Santa Claus or a Christmas dream,
Never sung of the first noel
Or all is calm, all is well
Is the child we need to share
The Christmas spirit with everywhere

He's the child who sheds a tear He's the child with hunger near

Got my Christmas, so have you, Feel I'm reflecting of the majority too, But somewhere there's a child who's never known, For the Christmas spirit has never been shown

He's the child that sheds a tear
Never smiles or had a cheer
Now it's Christmas time and he's tryin to live,
I said, it's Christmas time and he's tryin to live...
You see, he's the child with hunger near!

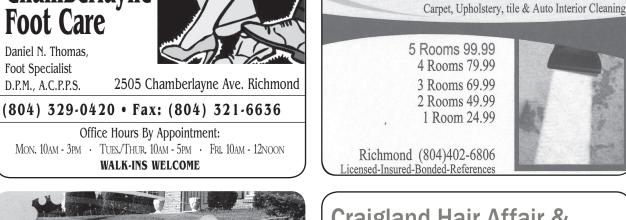

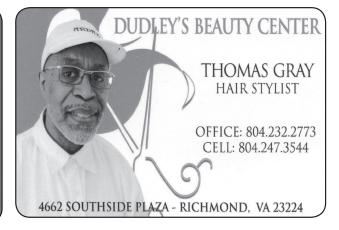

For He has instructed us also to "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." It is from this premise of spiritual obedience that the great works of public servant Mary Magdalene White Thompson is so derived.

So who is this great public servant, Mary Magdalene White Thompson? Mary is the sixth child of eight siblings of parents William Abner White and Maggie Lena Braxton White (both deceased). "I was born, bred and raised here in the East End/ Church Hill community at 1600 North 28th Street... I never lived anywhere else but Church Hill.... As a young girl I played in the streets of my beloved community."

Mary attended George Mason Elementary school and graduated from Armstrong High school in 1955. After which, she attended J. Sergeant Reynold's Community College, graduating cum laude in the Professional Secretarial program, with further matriculation at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) and the National Association of Education Office Professionals (NAEOP).

Mary served as Secretary and as an Administrative Office Professional for the Richmond Public Schools at Fairmont Elementary, REAL and Thirteen Acres schools where she retired after 40 years of service.

Mary and husband Deacon George W. Thompson, Jr celebrated their 57th year anniversary this past August. They are the blessed parents of 5 children, 10 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

"I first met my husband George in the 1200 block of Main Street. He and I were working across the street from each other... on this particular day I went to the bank to get some change for my employer... George came out of his building at the same time. He stopped me and asked me if I knew Obediah White... I looked at him strangely and said, yes, that's my brother. He said, 'You look just like him'. We went our separate ways... later I saw him again and we struck a conversation. With him it was love at first sight... but I didn't have love on my mind. He pursued and pursued and I was impressed with his persistence and finally I agreed to go out with him. Today, reflecting back, I realize that it was God's plan for our lives."

Mary shared with me how she became an obedient servant. "I'm a firm believer that God has a time line for all of us. I started out in 1956 when they had the Model City program in the East End community. At that time I was serving on the Education Committee, we were discussing the importance of parents taking more of a supportive role in the lives of their children... juvenile delinquency and so forth... something just triggered in me telling me that I need to not do this right now... I need to go home and take care of my own family first so that my children would not become a juvenile delinquent statistic. So I focused on raising my family first and then in 1992 I became actively and directly involved in the community,

Better Housing Coalition had come into the community to discuss what could be done with the rundown homes and the object blight occurring in our community. I attended the meeting held at Mt. Olivet Baptist church. After the meeting I began to think... why is it we don't have a community association here in our immediate community for our residents? So I started calling people in our community and we had our first meeting at Mt. Tabor Baptist Church. I invited members of Better Housing Coalition to attend... the CEO shared additional information of their vision for our community... so as a result of this we formed the New Visions Civic League of East End in 1993... that's how I got started in community building and service. I just felt that if others were going to come in to our community to develop and eradicate blight in our community, then we needed to have residents in the community actively involved. I felt that those coming in should serve as a supporting role to our vision of what we the

community residents wanted and needed to produce a more vibrant,

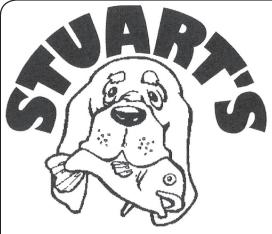

Dr. Pamela Hamilton-Stubbs, M.D. Sleep and Total Wellness Institute, LLC Now Located at 210 E. Brookland Park Blvd!

Dr. Pamela Hamilton-Stubbs got her start in Akron, Ohio as the middle child of the late Marion Hamilton and the late Lessie Mae Hamilton. From an early age, Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs wanted to become a doctor to help people, especially when she saw how her youngest brother suffered from severe asthma attacks. She graduated with honors from Buchtel High School in Akron and later with honors again from Kent State University where she majored in psychology and nursing. After earning a doctor of medicine degree from Meharry Medical School in Nashville, Tennessee, Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs completed an internship in internal medicine at Howard University, an internship in pediatrics at Louisiana State University, a residency in pediatrics at the University of Georgia, and a residency in neurology at the Medical College of Virginia. She is board certified in pediatrics and sleep disorders medicine.

After working for five years in the Medical College of Virginia's Sleep Lab, in 1997, the Lord blessed Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs to establish the Sleep Clinic for Children medical practice. The vision of the practice is access to health care for all people. The mission of the practice is to provide excellent service in the spirit of Christ who served both the rich and the poor.

When it started, the medical practice focused primarily on diagnosis and treatment of sleep disorders. As the practice has evolved, the focus has expanded to include preventive medicine. Thus, exercise (physical and spiritual), diet, stress reduction and rest all play important roles in Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs approach to maintaining health as well as preventing and treating illnesses. Accordingly, the name of the practice has changed from the Sleep Clinic for Children and Adults, LLC, to Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs' Sleep and Total Wellness Institute LLC.

When Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs opened her medical practice, she dedicated its service to God. She also began the Sleep Clinic for Children and Adults Christian Ministry ("The Ministry"). primary aim of the Ministry has been serving the Richmond, Virginia metropolitan area (and beyond) in the spirit of Christ who helped the rich and the poor. To appeal to and reach a broader portion of the general public, the Ministry has received a new name: "Partners in Health and Family Living" ("Partners"). While the name has changed, the mission remains fundamentally the same: Partners will continue to focus on serving the Richmond, Virginia metropolitan area through various activities in the spirit of Christ who helped the rich and the poor. The activities of Partners are presently funded primarily by Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs' Sleep and Total Wellness Institute, LLC although Partners also accepts contributions from private individuals.

In 1998, the Ministry formed and coordinated the activities of the Central Virginia Restless Legs Syndrome Support Group ("CVRLS Support Group"). The CVRLS Support Group was founded to provide free expert information and analysis to RLS sufferers and their families regarding the diagnosis, treatment, and etiology of Restless Legs Syndrome. Doctor Hamilton-Stubbs is primarily responsible for organizing the CVRLS Support Group. In May 2007, the Ministry co-sponsored and coordinated a free statewide meeting of all Virginia based RLS support groups. This statewide conference was open to the general public. In 2003, the Ministry began another community service through creation of "Bedtime in the City" parenting workshops. The



workshops provided free instruction and information to parents, guardians, and grandparents about (1) child development, (2) nutritional education, (3) appropriate literature and how to read to children of various ages (4) and recognizing signs as well as symptoms of sleep disorders. To help caregivers, the Ministry invited knowledgeable speakers who spoke to the caregivers of children under eight years of age on the importance of sleep to a child's development and success. In addition, the Ministry and other participants furnished relevant reading material. This activity was organized primarily by Doctor Hamilton-Stubbs and included pediatricians, mental health professionals, librarians, and dieticians.

In August 2014, the Ministry participated in a Richmond, Virginia community based "Back to School Program" and helped to educate public school students regarding the important relationship between sleep and learning.

In addition, Partners provides medical care to uninsured and under insured patients. For example, it provides specialty care to patients from the Cross Over Clinic, a free clinic operating in Richmond, Virginia and ministering to persons who were materially impoverished, uninsured, and under insured. Services that Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs has provided to the Cross Over Clinic included free evaluation of patients concerning possible sleep disorders and free treatment for patients with sleep disorders. These services are provided through office evaluations and/or interpretation of sleep studies.

For the foreseeable future, Partners plans to continue all the services currently provided to the Cross Over Clinic. In June 2007, in association with the Virginia Prostate Cancer Coalition, the Richmond Medical Society, and several local elected officials, the Ministry co-sponsored a Men's Health Fair. The half day program was held in Richmond, Virginia and featured lectures by academic research scientists from Hampton University and the University of South Carolina as well as a well respected local urologist. In addition, two prostate cancer "overcomers" addressed the attendees. The event was free and attracted approximately fifty members of the local community. Most of those who attended the program were members of underserved groups, principally, African American males. Partners in Health and Family Living plans a community health education initiative directed to residents of the Petersburg and Hopewell, Virginia metropolitan area. The program aims to enhance awareness of strategies to prevent and ameliorate

diseases like prostate cancer, diabetes, and sleep apnea. Dr. Pamela Hamilton-Stubbs, M.D. and Jonathan K. Stubbs (a prostate cancer overcome) will, with God's help, lead this outreach.

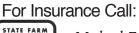
Jonathan Stubbs, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Ministry is an ordained Christian minister, Professor of Law at the University of Richmond, and attorney. Professor Stubbs has written a book entitled "Out of the Boat: Trusting God in Life's Storms" which deals with issues of his faith, fears and doubts following being diagnosed with early stage prostate cancer. The book is being used as part of the Ministry's community health education outreach program.

Since 2005, the Ministry has worked with the Lupus Foundation of Virginia to educate lupus patients, family members, health care providers, and members of the general public about lupus and its treatment. At the Lupus Foundation's annual meeting which typically draws approximately one hundred persons, Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs has been a regular presenter on the relationship of lupus and sleep. Dr. Hamilton-Stubbs has served on the Lupus Foundation Medical Advisory Board since 2006. In November 2012, in Petersburg, Virginia, Dr. Stubbs was the featured speaker on a program involving lupus and sleep sponsored by the Tri Cities Chapter of the Lupus Foundation of Virginia. In Fredericksburg, Virginia, in 2013, she addressed a statewide meeting of the Lupus Foundation. She also addressed the Lupus Foundation of Virginia annual meeting held in Richmond, Virginia during the fall of 2013. On November 16, 2014, she spoke again to the Lupus Foundation of Richmond, Virginia about the healing power of food as well as lifestyle changes in dealing with chronic diseases like Lupus.

Partners in Health and Family Living plans to continue the mission of the Sleep Clinic for Children and Adults Christian Ministry: mission to serve and improve the community in the Richmond, Virginia in the spirit of Christ who served the rich and the poor.

In addition, Partners in Health and Family Living is constantly communicating with community groups, churches, non-profit organizations, and leaders in Richmond, Virginia to formulate new ways to serve the community. For example Partners in Health and Family Living perceives an opportunity to expand its range of services to include disease prevention, control and cure thorough complementary and alternative medicine. Other areas in which Partners in Health and Family Living is likely to be active include community health education and addressing the needs of the elderly – especially related to decline of cognitive function. Moreover, Partners in Health and Family Living has a national and international dimension especially through its work with the UNESCO Chair for Human Rights in the United States. Each of the initiatives which have been outlined has been, is, or will focus upon the primary mission of Partners in Health and Family Living, which is the service of others in the spirit of Christ. DRUGS UNCUT: The Adrienne Jones Story! (reprint)

I want to take this opportunity to thank you Adrienne for your courage and your unending commitment in helping us to help others battling with the beast of addiction and affliction. By allowing us to use your testimony, a life somewhere is being snatched from the clutches of satan. So I thank you and all of the courageous warriors that you represent. We thank you all.

The Adrienne Jones Story: "I remember when I was in middle school, we would go to a young lady's house, who lived across from the bus stop and steal her mother's alcohol and drink it before going to school, I was about 14 or 15 at the time. From there I really didn't do any illicit drugs or heavy drinking until the age 21.

At age 21, I had moved out of my parents' home and was working at Apple Bee's restaurant. Some friends and co-workers took me out for my 21st birthday, I got trashed. A lot of people think that in order to be on drugs you have to grow up in a broken home. I didn't grow up like that. I grew up with both parents, making straight A's in school with plans to go to college. I came from a church going family, I was a goody, goody person.

I became friends with a young lady who appeared to me to always be having fun. She was living in the same complex that I was living in. She always had a bunch of guys over and I thought that I was missing out on something. I had a family member who was selling marijuana, so he hooked me up and I started selling it also. The young lady used to come to my house and cop from me. She was always high, nodding. I was curious to know what else was she doing besides smoking marijuana. She was doing heroin.

She said if you take this you're going to have a good time, you'll like the way you feel, you'll be more popular, just all the good things, so I took it. At 21, out on my own I almost overdosed. I was young and dumb. By then I had two children. I had a great job selling life insurance, making six-hundred to eight-hundred dollars a week. I started slaking up on work and not going to work. At this point I was getting high everyday. I would use my client's money to pay for drugs and then replace it when I got paid. I was also supporting my friend's habit. Needless to say I loss my job, my car, and my apartment. I had to move back home with my parents, plus I had started getting sick from using heroin. She didn't tell me that part at the beginning, she just told me about the up side of getting high. My whole character just went straight down. I started sleeping around.

For about two years, I was on and off of heroin. By then my family and I were attending Elohim Christian Outreach Center with Pastor Leo Hackett. I loved going to church because they made you feel welcome and they made you feel at home.

By this time Pastor Hackett and Deacon Anthony Johnson had started the ARM Ministry (Addiction Recovery Ministry) at the church. I joined, it helped me for about three years, I had thought about that time in my addiction that that would be my saving grace, but I had a bigger obstacle ahead of me. I started hanging around with somebody who was smoking crack.

She said, try this. She handed me a crack pipe, from that instant I was hooked and I just couldn't stop. I was working, I had another good job, I just lost my mind. I got put off of the methadone clinic because they don't deal with that. From that point my life spiraled down hill. I lost my second apartment, lost my job, I had a miscarriage and I lost all hope.

My addiction just took control. I thought using heroin and cocaine was bad but crack was no comparison. This time when I lost my apartment I started prostituting. I started doing more and more drugs. I got incarcerated. For two years I repeated the same cycle of prostituting, going to jail, etc.

My mother and my children got tired of watching me destroying my life. My mother took my children from me. By this time I had two girls and a baby boy. I wanted to straighten up my life for my children. I talked about it but I wasn't doing it. I hurt my children. I would come home high, I'd see their sad faces but



I didn't care. I was so selfish, the only thing I cared about was myself, satisfying my desire to get high. By the fourth time of repeating the cycle of getting high, prostituting, and going to jail. I was tired, I wanted to kill myself. I was so tired. If God hadn't sent somebody to talk me out of committing suicide on this particular evening, I would have jumped off the First Street bridge. I cried out to God, he sent me someone to the bridge who talked me out of jumping. The next day I got incarcerated because of an outstanding warrant for violating the Richmond drug court program. When I was released I was put on supervised probation. I had to go through an intensive out patient program. The judge released me from my probation. I've completed a parenting program. Recently I got custody of my children again. Being a felon, I thought that my life was over with. Many of my rights had been taken away from me. I thought that I would never find a job again to be able to support my children. Everywhere I went they turned me down because of my record. I felt like giving up but I didn't. Finally I was hired at Virginia

Union University.

That was one door that God opened for me. I have custody of my children. I'm clean and sober to this day, I thank God. I completed and was released off of the probation program. The only thing that is different today than times before is that I keep God in my life, up front, first and foremost. Before, I was straggling the fence. I was trying to help others in the past and couldn't help myself. I know now that if you're not fully there, you can't be any help to anyone else. I'm listening to my parents now. Any time the doors to the church are open I try to be there.

God allowed me to go through what I went through because He gives us choices in life. He will always supply our needs if we're willing to accept His help.

I could not have accomplished any of this without the support of my best friend, Malaika Green, my parents, Mr and Mrs Jones, my church family, Kingdom Life Church, Pastors Anthony and Atina Johnson, and the support of my children, and definitely not without the support of God. I love serving God-anyway I can"

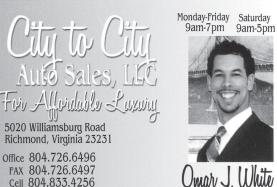
